

This diverse cast stretches from the Edwardian period to today, including first-person accounts of the key protest at the heart of the 2015 movie, Stonewall. The book shows how LGBT folk have always been in the forefront of progressive social evolution in the United States. It references heroes like Abraham Lincoln, Eleanor Roosevelt, Bayard Rustin, Harvey Milk, and Edie Windsor. Equally, the book honors names that aren't in history books, from participants in the Names Project, a national phenomenon memorializing 94,000 AIDS victims, to underground artists and activists not yet widely known.

At first I was surprised that this book featured chapters by various authors about particular events or people in LGBT history, but it works. Especially interesting were the chapters on the influence of the

women's movement and the peace movement on the LGBT liberation movement, essays on particular leaders, the battle against bigot Anita Bryant and the impact of AIDS. For the timeline version, Victory, by Linda Horseman, is better, but this one has superb essays by famous LGBT writers, so get both.

Having lived through this from the 40's to now , this was very inspiring and brought a lot of experiences into clarity. Our country still has a long way to go to catch up with the rest of the world.

Drawing a nearly comprehensive sketch of gay and lesbian life today by exploring many facets of its development--fraught with pain and sorrow as well as joy and success, one leaves this book with a feeling of inclusion and hope for the future.
