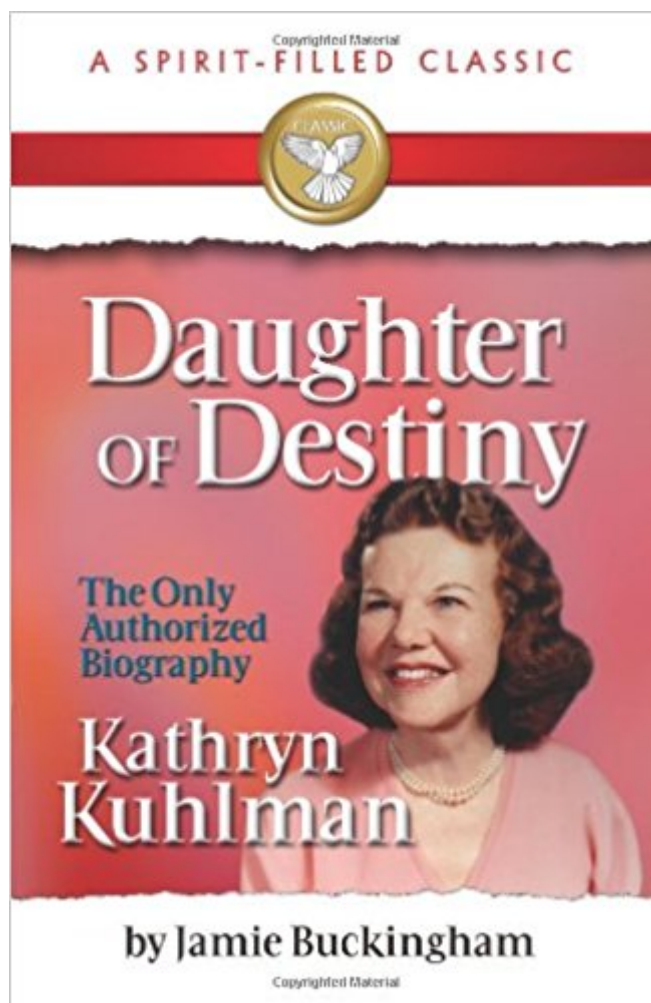


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Daughter Of Destiny: Kathryn Kuhlman

People are still talking about the miracles that occurred at her rallies. Hundreds of them were reviewed by doctors and have no explanation. I think she was the only faith healer that has never been exposed as a fraud. I went to several of her rallies in the 1970s and I cannot explain what I saw and experienced myself. I saw many healings and experienced being 'slain in the Spirit' as the book describes. This book tells the truth about Kuhlman, the author knew her well. He does not leave out anything and he tells her story including her divorce and the lawsuits with Dino. Because the author is a believer he raises the questions a believer would ask and Kuhlman and some of the

odd things about her spiritual life and her love of clothes and jewelry. Her prayer life in the last few years of her life was not what one would have expected. She was not a prayer warrior but was always in a state of prayer. Obviously she did so many services that he was hours in prayer at those. From the book can see that she was a vessel God used, a servant of the Holy Spirit; just as it should have been. She was exhausted in service to God at the end and her body just wore out. I recommend this book to anyone who wanted to learn about her, especially from a Christian standpoint. I wonder if miracles like we saw 40 years ago will ever happen again.

This book offers an honest look at the life of Kathryn Kuhlman. I found it to be truthful. While it does offer the truth, it is NOT filled with the tabloid hype that many of the books written about her seem to be filled with. Miss Kuhlman comes across as a very caring woman who only wants to minister to those who are ill. I know several people who worked for her and they said the same thing - she would cry and ask God why some were healed and others not. She often blamed herself - did she not pray enough, was her life not what God wanted, was it her fault. I also came to understand why she had her "team" surrounding her while she ministered to those who were ill. So many people felt that if they could just "touch" her, God would heal them. She said it over and over again, that SHE was not the healer - THAT ONLY GOD CAN HEAL, so she tried to keep people from touching her for that reason. She wanted people to look to God for their healing = NOT TO KATHRYN KUHLMAN. A VERY GOOD READ.

I liked this book not for its perfection of grammar or beauty of language. I liked this book not because it's the best biography ever written, but because nestled in its pages I found a wonderful glimpse of one of the greatest testimonies of the work of God ever. This book presented Kathryn Kuhlman as she was. An imperfect but wholly dedicated vessel who was willing to allow God to use her imperfections and her strengths to do His work. It drew me into the experience of living her life as she lived in and unlike many biographies presented a balanced view of her in a way that authenticates her ministry. Encouraging. Challenging. Fast paced. Realistic. Inspirational. Definitely worth a read.

I would recommend this to two groups especially: those with a deep hunger to know the nature of the Holy Spirit and those entering ministry (including those who have been in ministry and feel stalled). Don't look at this book as a juicy tell all where you get to snicker at this woman of God and her missteps. Instead be humbled by her shortcomings as they surely reflect our own. Be amazed

at the grace and favor of God as He powerfully uses a broken (for better and for worse) vessel. I learned so much about how the Holy Spirit operates, the burden of responsibility on those that are called into ministry and the differentiation between man's talents and God's power.

Doesn't pull any punches in telling about her successes and so-called failures. Reading this book and the ones about doctor-documented miracles that took place in her ministry will really help you build your own faith to receive the miracles Jesus gave his life to give all of us.

After all these decades that have passed since Kuhlman's death, it's interesting that the life of this female evangelist could interest me so much. If you're a skeptic of faith healers or even an atheist, you'll still be intrigued. What makes it so great is that Buckingham, himself a man of God (and one who dared, early on, to question the tactics of media evangelists), doesn't gloss over the faults and frailties of Ms Kuhlman. She was a very flawed character for sure. Yet, you can't just write her off as a charlatan or a kook; she had something incredible going on that increased the faith of thousands and transformed their lives.

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
