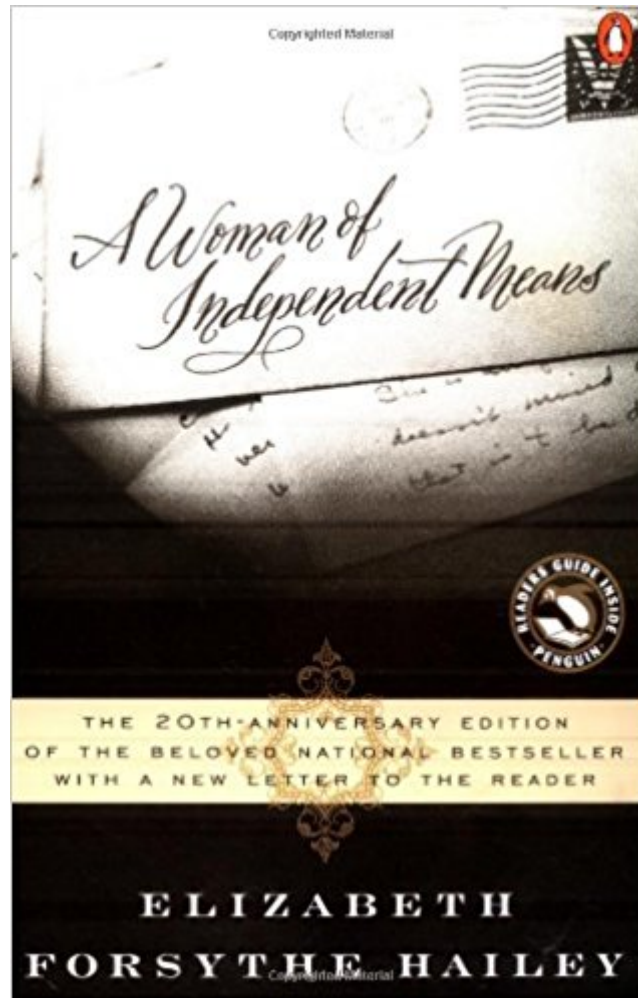

Bess Steed is a fully fleshed out character, one the reader can imagine coming across in reality. Written in the form of letters makes the story warmly personal. Yes, it's old, but it is historical so that's just fine.
