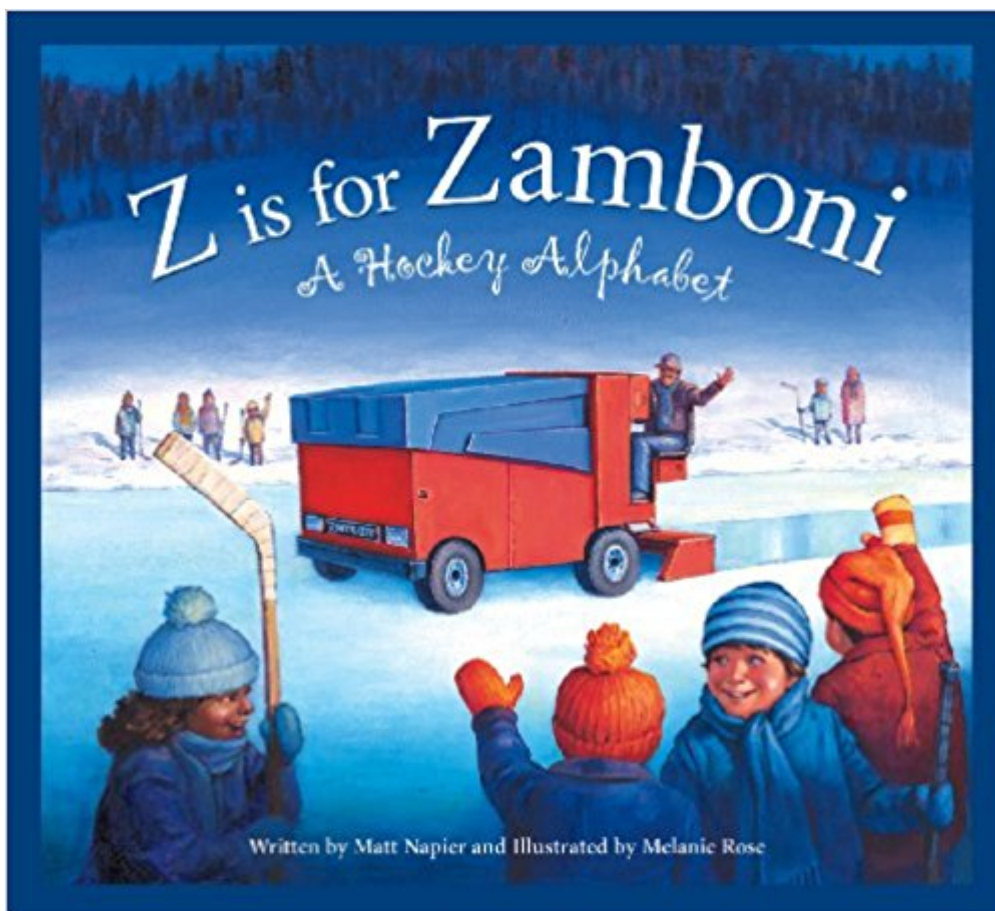

The board book is very well constructed - highly recommend this for your chewing, ripping, destroying little one :) The board book is a condensed version of the full sized edition but the pictures are great, the size is perfect, and there's enough text to get a conversation going between you and your little one. When my guy gets a little older I plan on buying the full sized edition with additional text, but for now this is perfect for him.

I bought this for my son because my husband is a hockey guy. I bought a second one for a friend who is having a baby boy to start off their library. Can be read at the high level or there is more text that goes into details and history that is cool for adults or older kids.

I bought this for my son, because we are a big hockey family. He is 10 months old, so he is not old enough to appreciate this yet, but I sure can! This book is so darn cute! It's a board book, so nothing too big to report on that part, but whoever illustrated and wrote this book, was creative and spot on! The book goes through each letter of the alphabet, relating it to hockey. One of the pages, has Bobby Hull illustrated, and it looks JUST like him!! Cute book, and great illustrations! I will definitely be recommending to everyone that loves hockey and has kids, (or knows kids, for that matter)!!

This was a gift for my hockey-crazed four-year old nephew, along with the number hockey book. He is always on the go and it is difficult to get him to focus on anything for a long period of time. However, after giving him these books, he immediately sat down and looked through the whole book! I like that it has a short rhyming sentence for the younger child, but there is more information on the side of each page to engage him in when he gets older. I think the alphabet book is a little better written, but both books are excellent and a great tool for encouraging reading while keeping

one's interest.

Looks like a little kids book, but very detailed. Might be for someone you are introducing hockey to, but not sure it would be a child's book.

Some of the letters are kind of boring, but I guess you can't have something as cute as "Z is for zamboni" on every page.
